Chairman's Year In Review

This year has been another challenging year in terms of the COVID pandemic and developing new ways of doing business along with coming to terms with Zoom meetings and Virtual Conventions.

Credit unions began in Australia in 1946, reaching a peak of 1,119 and the number of mutuals has now declined to 60.

It's interesting when you look at today's mutuals, as many of them are made up of many credit unions through mergers. The trust holds records of many of these past credit unions and trade bodies, including information on industry identities along with the many unsung heroes of past credit unions', namely Directors, CEO/General Managers and staff. The trust's role is to keep these records available for researchers, students, mutuals and former people (or relatives) involved in the movement to review their involvement along with historians writing articles or books on mutuals or the movement.

Due to a number of mergers in the industry, there are now fewer mutuals to fund our trust. It does mean we need to act now to secure our future. We are calling on our peers to contribute to our organisation and keep this trust operating. Contributors enable our professional staff to continue our activities supporting the mutual financial services sector, including records transfers and providing access to our collection.

Our key highlights of the year:

- Welcomed COBA Finance Manager, Rosemary Harris as our new Voluntary Treasurer
- Redesigned website
- Participated as an exhibitor at the COBA virtual convention
- Posted 50 articles on the history of individual credit unions and the mutual banking movement in 2021, we had nearly 3,200 readers of our blog
- Produced four editions of Archives Newsletter
- Joined consortium with representatives of BCCM, Sydney University Business School and others on a major project seeking grant funding to digitise co-operative and credit union records enhancing accessibility
- Increased our collection of digital annual reports, newsletters and governance documents
- Assisted with the CUFA 50 Years book and The Capricornian history project and were contracted to write the history of Traditional Credit Union in 2022

On behalf of our staff and trustees we would like to wish all mutuals' staff and Directors a Merry Christmas and better New Year as hopefully the impacts of COVID will start to subside.

Comtax Credit Union was created in 1971 via the marriage of Income Tax Officers Credit Union and the Fourth Division Taxation Officers Credit Union. In 2008 it went into partnership with Security Credit Union forming Allied Members Credit Union. Comtax and Security maintained their brand names and hoped to prosper but various forces – regulatory, technological and perhaps others - saw them transfer engagements to Sydney Credit Union.
